### **NO to Postbox!**

Despite several approaches to Royal Mail and the Postal Review Panel, by Residents, Shop Owners, Bellyeoman Community Council, local Councillors, MSP Bill Walker and via Mr Walker, Vince Cable MP, Royal Mail has decided they will not reinstate the postbox on Townhill Road.

We also approached the Operations Manager of the Co-op, who stated he would accept a post box, if the Royal Mail approached them. The Royal Mail said due to the yellow lines round the Co-op it was not a suitable site and there were no suitable alternative sites.

The Post Review Panel said Royal Mail were fulfilling their legal obligations to provide the required density of posting facilities in the area. We contacted the Ombudsman, who said it was outwith their jurisdiction.

### **FC Carnegie go from Strength to Strength**

Local football team, FC Carnegie '97 have changed their name a little to FC Carnegie. They have a number of members from Bellyeoman and Townhill.

The team couldn't secure pitches in the local area and so are playing at the Carnegie Institute, Rosyth and hope local businesses are keen to get involved. Bellyeoman Community Council is proud to have played a small part in sponsoring the team.

This year the team have had a visit from Kilmarnock Manager and Chick Young from BBC Scotland. They also donated a Liverpool top to the Pars Fans fund raising campaign.

The team are also talking with Cllr William Campbell to discuss support for revitalising football for our younger residents and meeting the Parent Teacher Association at Bellyeoman Primary School.

### **Queen Margaret Hospital**

A lot is happening at Queen Margaret Hospital.

The Minor Injuries Service operates 24hrs a day, although Accident & Emergency is now located at the Victoria Hospital, Kirkcaldy. Minor Injuries can include: simple fractures; back, shoulder & rib injuries; ankle, knee & wrist sprains, minor neck & head injuries; cuts & grazes which may need dressing & stitching; and minor burns and scalds.

In addition many clinics which were based in other buildings around Dunfermline and Fife are either relocating or planning to relocate to Queen Margaret Hospital.
